Diploma in High School in 1977. I achieved my Degree in Medicine and Surgery at the University of Naples with Summa Cum Laude in 1983; I specialized in Cardiology at the University of Naples, with Summa Cum Laude in 1986 and in Cardiac Surgery at the University of Naples in 1991.

From April 1984 to December 1997 I was a part-time assistant at the Department of Cardiology and Cardiac Surgery University of Naples.

I studied for an MSc in Primary Care & General Practice as an external student at the University of Ulster (United Kingdom) from October 2004-June 2008. The final Research Dissertation title: To determine the potential for improving quality of care of hypertensive patients with type 2 diabetes in a population of a rural area in Southern Italy.

Since January 1998 I have been a full time general practitioner (in my own practice), in my home town of Ruviano, which is a rural village, about 50 kms North East of Naples.

I have been the President of the Provincial Branch of SNAMID (Italian Scientific Society of General Practitioners) since January 2006.

Since 2001 I have been member of European Academy of Teachers in General Practice and Family Medicine (EURACT) and World Organization of Family Doctors (WONCA), and since 2002 member of the European General Practice Research Network (EGPRN).

Since 2008 National Representative of EGPRN; in 2010 I was elected to be a member of the EGPRN Executive Board.

I have also been involved in the translation of the EURACT Educational Agenda, the EGPRN Research Agenda and the publication of the Classification Manual ICPC-2R (International Classification of Primary Care) from English into the Italian language.

Since 2001, I have presented many posters and papers, and organized workshops at the EGPRN and WONCA conferences.
